Despite being free from the traditional 'heavy machinery' stereotype of engineering, the audio engineering and visual technology industries remain male-dominated. ESF funding was awarded for the Women Audio Video Engineers (WAVE) research project which has spent the last 12 months examining and evaluating gender segregation in this industry in order to produce practical strategies which may help to influence the effective recruitment and participation of women in this high-growth sector.

The researchers have done in-depth interviews with male and female participants across the North West to try and uncover the reasons why women do not enter, do not progress, or do not stay in the industry.

This conference will present the key findings from the research and will give delegates the chance to discuss these findings with members of the panel.
